Degree: Associate of Science in Education (AS)

Program Description: The Associate of Science degree in Education is intended to match, within the constraints of the Core Curriculum, the course of study for the first two years of a typical interdisciplinary studies (education) degree at a four-year college or university. It also provides the flexibility for students desiring only an associate degree to specialize in the program to meet individual interests. This degree allows for two extra early childhood/education courses in this degree program.

Students have flexibility in the actual scheduling of courses and decisions about number of hours per semester.***
