

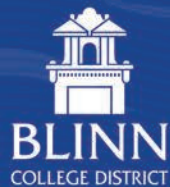
**Anthropology** is the study of humans in the past or present. Anthropology literally means “the study of man.”

Introduction to Physical Anthropology  
**ANTH 2301** - Also offered online  
3 Hours Social Science OR Science Credit

The study of human origins and bio-cultural adaptations. Topics may include primatology, genetics, human variation, forensics, health, and ethics in the discipline.



Introduction to Archaeology  
**ANTH 2302**  
3 Hours Social Science Credit

The study of the human past through material remains. Discussed are the methods and theories relevant to topics such as the adoption of agriculture, response to environmental change, the emergence of complex societies, and ethics in the discipline.



General Anthropology  
**ANTH 2346** - Also offered online  
3 Hours Social Science Credit

The study of human beings, their antecedents, related primates, and their cultural behavior and institutions. Introduces the major subfields: physical and cultural anthropology, archeology, linguistics, their applications, and ethics in the discipline. **ICD credits at TAMU**



Cultural Anthropology  
**ANTH 2351** - Also offered online  
3 Hours Social Science Credit

The study of human cultures. Topics may include social organization, institutions, diversity, interactions between human groups, and ethics in the discipline. **ICD credits at TAMU**



Introduction to Physical Anthropology with Lab  
**ANTH 2401**  
4 Hours Science Credit

The study of human origins and bio-cultural adaptations. Topics may include primatology, genetics, human variation, forensics, health, and ethics in the discipline. Includes laboratory with hands-on practice identifying non-human primate, fossil hominid, and modern human skeletal structures and analyzing forensic evidence.
