Alcohol Survey

Executive Summary

In Spring 2016, Blinn College surveyed 2,483 students age 21 and over and 6,629 students under age 21 regarding their use of alcoholic beverages. Sampling was used to select the survey population rather than sending the surveys to the whole Blinn College student population. The survey was done as a part of Blinn College's efforts to support the Community Alcohol & Substance Awareness Partnership (CASAP). In Spring 2014, 429 students 21 and over responded (8% response rate) compared to 246 students (10% response rate) in Spring 2016, reflecting a two percent response rate increase. In Spring 2014, 637 students under 21 responded (6% response rate); in Spring 2016, 557 students under 21 responded (9% response rate) to the surveys, reflecting a three percent increase in response rate.

- The majority of respondents 21 and over would not buy/provide alcohol to minors (76.4%) which is slightly higher than the responses from Spring 2014 (73.2%). Comment content analysis cited the main reason for not providing/buying alcohol for minors is because it is illegal.
- More than half of respondents in both groups reported drinking one or more alcoholic beverages during the past 30 days (under 21, 54.9%; 21 and over, 68.9%). These results are similar to those from Spring 2014 (under 21, 53.5%; 21 and over, 70.2%).
- Almost 4 percent of respondents 21 and over in Spring 2016 felt there was no risk at all (3.7%) of harming themselves or others when they have five or more drinks once or twice a week. In Spring 2014 under 3 percent of respondents 21 and over (2.6%) responded no risk at all. The perception of risk decreased from Spring 2014 to Spring 2016 for respondents 21 and over. For that same question, more respondents under 21 in Spring 2016 felt there was no risk (9.9%) than respondents under 21 in Spring 2014 who reported no risk (6.5%).
- Respondents under 21 reported finding it somewhat or very easy to get alcohol (66.9%). The percent of respondents under 21 from spring 2014 was nearly ten percent lower in spring 2014 (57.3%) compared to spring 2016.

Recommendations

- Because of the ease of obtaining alcohol by students under 21 from family members and/or older friends, agencies should investigate ways to stress the legal ramifications of purchasing alcohol for minors. In Texas, a person may provide alcohol to a minor if s/he is the minor's adult parent, guardian or spouse and is visibly present when the minor possesses or consumes the alcoholic beverage. "Other" family members are not included in this law.
- Although the percentages of students who responded no risk to the question about perception of risk harming themselves or others when they have five or more drinks once or twice a week, the percentage of students selecting that answered increased in both groups. For Spring 2014; under 21, 6.5%; 21 and over, 2.6% and for Spring 2016, under 21, 9.9%; 21 and over 3.7%. Agencies should investigate students' perception of risk based on the results that the respondents 21 and over and under 21 had a decreased perception of risk from Spring 2014 to Spring 2016.
- Eighty-six percent of students age 21 and over said they were "likely" or "very likely" to use a Safe Ride program after drinking. The results from this question from Spring 2014 were similar (85.5%). Implementation for this type of program should begin if there is not one currently available.








7. How much do you think people risk harming themselves or others when they drive a car under the influence of alcohol?



- 1) I don't really know many people under the age of 21
2) I have gotten somebody arrested before for buying me alcohol under age, so I know how easy it is to get caught
- A close relative of mine got sent to prison for having alcohol in the car with a minor present. I have witnessed how a choice like that can affect your entire life. I do not want to derail my life in such a way.
- Alcohol is a really danger for people. It should be used moderately. In addition, minors are prohibited to drink it. Drive drunk=a ticket for jail.
- All my friends are of age now, and Im not cool enough to buy alcohol for rando minors.

- Fear of getting caught
- First of all , it is the law. I feel that if a person is not able to purchase alcohol themselves then no one else should buy it for them even if they had their own money.
- For starters, it's illegal as well as the consequences of providing the opportunity for a minor to harm themselves and others is too great of a risk. With that, you're also potentially starting a habit for the minor that could eventually lead to alcohol dependency for that person because their reasoning and logic is not fully developed at that age.  - I have only provided alcohol to minors a few times and that was because they were family and only drinking with family and not driving anywhere. Other than those situations I would not provide alcohol to minors because they tend not to know any better and end up doing things that they are not suppose to be doing to begin with.
 - I have personal morals, and its against the law
 - I know first hand the consequences of underage drinking. Even after ten years a minor in possession was haunting me.
 - I think drinking age should be 18.
 - I try not to hang out with people younger than me.
 - I try to be responsible.
 - I waited 21 years to buy my first beer, if I can do it so can everyone else. I never bought alcohol as a minor (consumed; yes) so I wouldn't even acknowledge the thought.
 - I would NOT use the Safe Ride program since most of those offer rides within like a city. I live an hour & 15 min away. I choose NOT to drink.

- Minors have no business drinking. I drank as a minor and received harsh punishment for doing so. The judge revoked my license for 45 days, ordered community service and an alcohol awareness/guidance course as well as fines and fees. The more minors drink the more likely they are to develop problems early becoming alcoholics later. As a new mother I cant imagine EVER buying a minor alcohol. Too many kids die from alcohol poisoning or kill someone else because they drove. Minors do not have the proper decision making skills to say when enough is enough and end up in the hospitals, jails or morgue.
- Minors should not be drinking alcohol even if they think they are mature enough to handle it.
